

## The 15th Core Group Meeting of the TB/HIV Working Group

The 15<sup>th</sup> Core Group meeting of the TB/HIV Working Group of the Stop TB Partnership will take place from 3-4 November 2009 in Geneva, Switzerland. It will be hosted by the World Health Organization.

The meeting will have the following specific objectives:

- Review progress in the implementation of collaborative TB/HIV activities and catalyze nationwide expansion of TB/HIV collaborative activities in high burden TB/HIV countries, including the Three Is for HIV/TB.
- Review the implementation of the revised and harmonized monitoring and evaluation indicators and guidelines and discuss critical issues to strengthen the documentation and report of activities by the HIV stakeholders.
- Discuss innovative strategies to integrate TB and HIV services to achieve universal access to
  prevention, treatment, care and support, and review their implications in the context of health
  systems strengthening.
- Review the revised TB/HIV research priorities and strategize on next steps to enhance research interest and investment.
- Review the efforts to improve the expedited diagnosis of TB in people living with HIV including laboratory strengthening and discuss the way forward.
- Review new methods for enhancing community mobilization for nation-wide scale-up
- Discuss Core Group and Working Group administration issues: election (chair and co-chair for the Working Group and the TB infection control sub-group) and institutional memberships.
